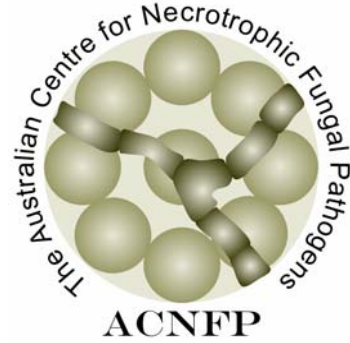


PhD scholarships are now available Perth, Western Australia
